Description: The psychologist provides direct clinical services to clients served by Comprehensive Child Crisis Services (CCCS). These services include crisis interventions, psychological evaluations, individual, family, collateral, and group psychotherapy and case management. **Evening and weekend hours are required. PATIENT/CLIENT POPULATION: under 18 years of age.**

Primary Duties and Responsibilities (other duties may be assigned):

Under immediate supervision of the Clinical Coordinator:

- Provide crisis assessments (5150), triage, stabilization, case management, and direct treatment and collaboration with children, youth and their families
- Psychological testing
- Collaboration with community agencies
- Develops service plans to meet consumer's goals and objectives
- Provides direct services (includes individual, collateral, family, group therapy, case management, and telephone intervention) on and off site
- Provides crisis interventions and short term therapeutic services
- Provides information and referrals to callers regarding program and related community resources and services as requests occur
- Participate in training, supervision, and consultation activities
- Maintains charts on all clients in accordance with Quality Assurance policies and procedures.
- Consults with Triage OD or Program Director for all crisis evaluations and referrals

Required Qualifications:

1. Possession of a current, valid license in psychology issued by the California Board of Psychology as defined in Chapter 6.6 of the Business and Professions Code; Psychology Licensing Law, Sections 2900-2903, 2914; **OR**
- 2a. Possession of a Ph.D. degree in Clinical Psychology or a doctoral degree deemed equivalent by the Psychology Examining Committee in accordance with Section 2914 of the Psychology Licensing Law;
AND
- 2b. Completion of 1,500-clock hours pre or postdoctoral internship in Clinical Psychology, supervised academically performing psychological examinations, diagnoses, and

psychotherapy in a clinic, hospital, correctional institution, rehabilitation or diagnostic center, or similar setting.

Verification/Waiver: Verification of qualifying experience, education, and/or training is required at the time of filing. Candidates unable to do so may submit a letter requesting a waiver of this requirement indicating the reason(s) verification cannot be obtained. Failure to submit verification or request for waiver will result in application rejection

Desired Qualifications:

- Experience in psychiatric emergency field/behavioral health management
- Experience with children's mental health
- Demonstrated commitment to multidisciplinary teamwork
- Demonstrated cultural competency working with diverse cultures and communities
